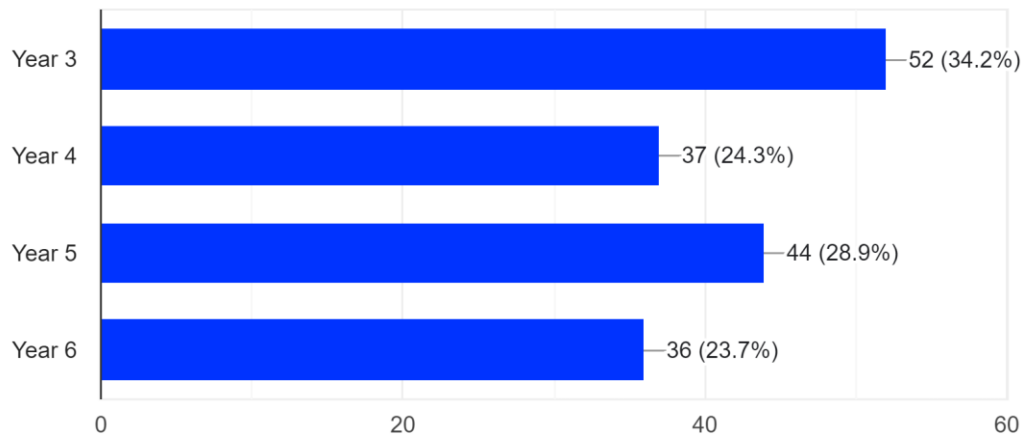




## SRE Parent/Carer Consultation September 2020

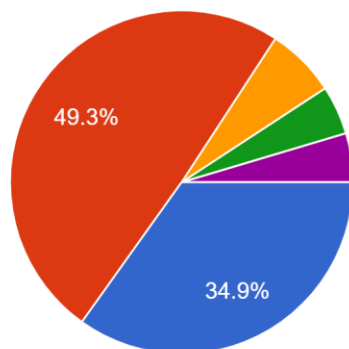
Which year group/s are your children currently in?

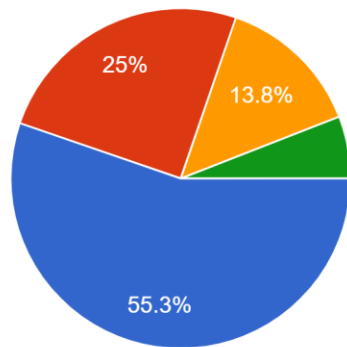

Q2: When should we teach children about body parts? We teach children about the names of male and female body parts and currently teach this in YEAR 5. We teach boys and girls separately for this.

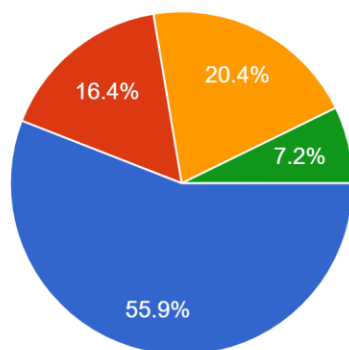

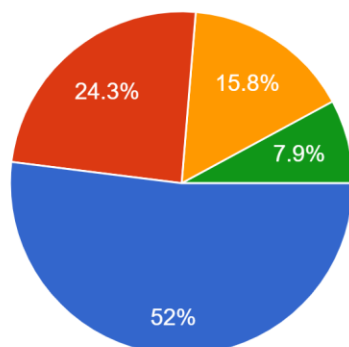

Q4: When should we teach children about menstruation (periods)? We teach about the physical process of menstruation and about sanitary product...R 6. We teach boys and girls separately for this.

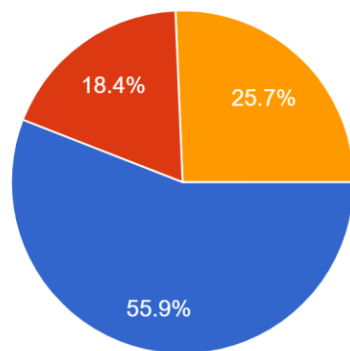
